## *Koinōvia (Koinonia)*

koinā' nēā, noun: Christian fellowship

*But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.*

(Galatians 5:22-26, NIV)

I can't remember who gave it to me, but one year for Christmas I got an iced tea maker. I loved iced tea then just as I do today. The gift was very thoughtful and appropriate. But for whatever reason, I never used it. In fact, I don't think that I ever took it out of the box. A year or two later, I couldn't figure out what to give a friend of mine for that particular Christmas. So you know what I thought? *I bet he'd love an iced tea maker!*

Re-gifting. Maybe you got two of the same thing. Maybe the color wasn't your style or it didn't fit, or you just never found yourself using it. Maybe there were too many people to buy for and not enough money in the bank account. For whatever reason, many of us have taken the liberty of re-gifting an item (or two). We just hope that we don't accidentally re-gift the present back to the person who gave it to us.

This year, as we enter the Advent season, our focus should be on the expectation of God's gift to us: Jesus Christ, the promised messiah. But we all know that the shopping list, the holiday parties, the Christmas music, and the gift-wrapping will keep us plenty occupied during the next few weeks. So I want each of you to take this idea of re-gifting with you into this season. Although, I am not talking about the iced tea maker or the sweater with a Rudolph cut-out sewn on the front. Let us re-gift the gifts that have been given to us in Christ.

Through the life, death and raising of Jesus, God has done something amazing for us. We have been given admission into the eternal presence of our Creator. We have been given the keys to the

Kingdom of God. The gifts that come to us through the Messiah are Hope, Peace, Joy, Love and Light. And the remarkable thing about these gifts is that the way that you keep them is by giving them away.

The gifts of faith in Christ are gifts that were *made* for re-gifting. In fact, the Lord commands us to pass these gifts on to others in our commission to share the Gospel. This Christmas, have fun wrapping and unwrapping the thoughtful things that we give to one another as an expression of our affection. But be bold in giving the most important gifts you will give as a human being: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love and Light.

Finally, please remember that among our neighbors are people who are in need of even the most basic material things this holiday season: food, clothing, shelter. The Salvation Army, which we partner with each year to raise money by ringing the bell and participating in the Angel Tree program, offers meaningful ways to experience the greatest gift discipleship offers: faith in action. And we aren't limited to December to help. God asks us to serve the poor every month of the year. In the New Testament, we find:

*What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead (James 2:14-17).*

May this season of Advent be a blessing to you.
